We've learnt much, and continue to learn and grow, as an organisation and a community who seek to serve each other, especially those whom society disadvantages or marginalises.

Early in Delta Trust's journey it became clear that our values needed to be expressed in a dynamic and nuanced way that anyone can interpret and apply Inspiration from the Chair for themselves. And so, through the Delta Fellowship the Delta Pictorial Creed was commissioned and later adopted as the embodiment of the vision and values of our whole organisation. It continues to guide us today.

As you read this prospectus, I hope you sense Delta's heartbeat and see our creed embodied and alive in who we are and what our participants, members, clients, the wider community, volunteers, staff and trustees actually do. History, Purpose, and Beyond

Delta Community Support Trust, originally a mission of North Avon Baptist Church, registered as a charitable trust in 1995. We began operating from the Church's lounge with the vision to support and empower people living in disadvantaged circumstances.

Since those early days, Delta has grown substantially in response to local and citywide community needs and aspirations. Between 2003 and 2019, we operated from the former Shirley Rugby Club. In late 2019 with earthquake insurance settlement funds and extra fundraising, the Church and Delta Trust were able to complete and move into a new building on the former church building site. A second connected Stage 2 building by Crossway Community Church was completed in early 2021. Together the two buildings are now known as the North Avon Community Centre at 101 North Avon Road and operate as one facility. This modern, comfortable, and more energyefficient facility is an excellent asset for our local community. It provides Delta Trust with great spaces from which to continue our community activities and services.

After the North Avon Baptist Church ceased operations in 2021, Delta continued its work in the community. Now connected to and supported by the Canterbury Westland Baptist Association (CWBA), together we move forward with the Trust's Charitable Purposes. "To meet the social, emotional, physical, spiritual, and educational needs of the people of its local and wider Christchurch community. To alleviate the difficulties of those experiencing hardships of whatever kind, including financial hardship, and to bring relief through whatever means are available. To initiate, establish, and administer community services for people of all ages who, for any reason, need care, counseling or assistance. To carry out such other charitable purposes within New Zealand as the Trustees shall determine."

Through dedicated staff and volunteers, thousands of people have been supported by and involved in Delta over the years, making a significant difference in their experience of community life.

Evergreen Club

Evergreen is our weekday programme for older adults aged 65 and over who live independently or with minimal support. Open Monday to Friday, the programme hosts up to 25 participants each day for a nourishing two-course lunch, morning and afternoon tea, and a full schedule of activities designed to support health, wellbeing, and connection. Evergreen also offers essential respite for carers, providing peace of mind that their loved ones are in a safe, stimulating, and compassionate environment. Funded primarily by Te Whatu Ora - Health New Zealand Waitaha Canterbury, this service is free for participants with a referral from their GP or health provider.

"For me it is gentle, kind, and soothing. For someone who hasn't been cared for, nor cares for themselves, it's an act of love—it brings joy. The way in which I've been cared for allows me to feel that I am worthy."

Friendship Link

Friendship Link celebrates and empowers people with intellectual disabilities through connection, creativity, and shared leadership. Held three days a week, this dynamic programme is shaped by the people who attend—offering social activities, pampering, crafts, dancing, gym sessions, and more. It's a place where friendships are formed, confidence grows, and everyone has a voice in what comes next. At Friendship Link, inclusion isn't an add-on it's the heart of everything we do.

Support Services

Advocacy and Budgeting Support

When life becomes overwhelming, having someone to help navigate the system can make all the difference. Our team offers one-on-one support to individuals and families who are under financial pressure or facing complex life situations. We assist with budgeting, benefit entitlements, and connecting people to the right services for housing, health, and wellbeing. This support helps build resilience and restores hope - empowering people to take back control of their lives.

Footprints Café & Delta Inn

These two warm, welcoming spaces offer more than just a hot drink or a bite to eat. Open to anyone for a small donation, our cafés create an environment where people can relax, make friends, and feel seen. For many, it's a first step out of isolation, or a regular highlight in a lonely week. They're places where community is built over tea, laughter, and good conversation.

Emergency Food Support

We offer emergency food support through our advocacy and budgeting team. For those facing hardship, this assistance is part of a broader conversation - one that explores the root causes of need and works toward practical, personalised solutions. While food is still available in urgent situations, it now comes with wraparound support that upholds dignity, builds resilience, and promotes long-term wellbeing.

Our programmes also include ESOL Classes, and an international playgroup for mothers and their preschoolers.
