We emerged from the desire of ordinary people in a local church Richmond, Ōtautahi/Christchurch who wanted people in their neighbourhood to experience positive change and personal growth through the love of Christ, holistically expressed. As Delta tried to do that over the years many needs came to light, people and whānau struggling with all kinds of hardship, mental ill-health, disability, loneliness and more. In trying to respond with compassion and passion in small ways one community ministry led to another and another. As this work in Northeast Christchurch unfolded people from all around Ōtautahi began hearing about what Delta Trust was doing and wanted to be involved, to get and/ or give support. I'm one of those people. Thus, we grew organically into the unique mix of community support activities and services we offer today. A lively, diverse and messy community has formed and evolved around our services and activities, with relationships, belonging and inclusiveness drawing people in.

We've learnt much, and continue to learn and grow, as an organisation and a community who seek to serve each other, especially those whom society disadvantages or marginalises. Early in Delta Trust's journey it became clear that our values needed to be expressed in a dynamic and nuanced way that anyone can interpret and apply

for themselves. And so, through the Delta Fellowship the Delta Pictorial Creed was commissioned and later adopted as the embodiment of the vision and values of our whole organisation. It continues to guide us today. As you read this prospectus, I hope you sense Delta's heartbeat and see our creed embodied and alive in who we are and what our participants, members, clients, the wider community, volunteers, staff and trustees actually do.

I can assure you from my own experience that Delta changes you! We're real about this too though because we know personal growth is not linear nor is community development easy. Sometimes it's one step forward and two back. We all need grace. Always!

We invite you to consider whether you're feeling a call to get involved and/ or support us. There's always room at the table for one more. Could that be you?

# History, Purpose, and Beyond

Delta Community Support Trust, originally a mission of North Avon Baptist Church, registered as a charitable trust in 1995. We began operating from the Church's lounge with the vision to support and empower people living in disadvantaged circumstances. Since those early days, Delta has grown substantially in response to local and city-wide community needs and aspirations.

Between 2003 and 2019, we operated from the former Shirley Rugby Club. In late 2019 with earthquake insurance settlement funds and extra fundraising, the Church and Delta Trust were able to complete and move into a new building on the former church building site. A second connected Stage 2 building by Crossway Community Church was completed in early 2021.

Together the two buildings are now known as the North Avon Community Centre at 101 North Avon Road and operate as one facility. This modern, comfortable, and more energy-efficient facility is an excellent asset for our local community. It provides Delta Trust with great spaces from which to continue our community activities and services.

After the North Avon Baptist Church ceased operations in 2021, Delta continued its work in the community. Now connected to and supported by the Canterbury Westland Baptist Association (CWBA), together we move forward with the Trust's Charitable Purposes.

"To meet the social, emotional, physical, spiritual, and educational needs of the people of its local and wider Christchurch community. To alleviate the difficulties of those experiencing hardships of whatever kind, including financial hardship, and to bring relief through whatever means are available. To initiate, establish, and administer community services for people of all ages who, for any reason, need care, counseling or assistance. To carry out such other charitable purposes within New Zealand as the Trustees shall determine."

Through dedicated staff and volunteers, thousands of people have been supported by and involved in Delta over the years, making a significant difference in their experience of community life.

#### Food Bank

The Foodbank is a vital service in our surrounding community, providing last resort emergency food relief for over 1,500 individuals and families/whānau each year. We give out more than 3,000 food parcels, and more than 16,000 loaves of bread, buns, and muffins.

#### **Budgeting and Advocacy**

We understand the difficulty of budgeting when income is insufficient to cover everyday essentials or one-off expenses. Help is available for supporting the repayment of personal debt and/or with purchasing necessity household items. We can also advocate on behalf of people regarding benefit payments, housing and bills etc.

#### Community Meal and Café

Providing the opportunity for people in our community to share life together. On a Friday, for a generous-sized hot meal and dessert. Or enjoying a cuppa and baking, or light lunch in the warm, friendly atmosphere of our Monday Café.

#### Cultural Support for Migrants and Refugees

We work with those new to Aotearoa New Zealand, giving them the support, they need to get established and make themselves more at home here. Our programmes include ESOL Classes, and an international playgroup for mothers and their preschoolers.

Our vision is to include and empower all people with intellectual disability by encouraging participation and personal growth. We seek to encourage and acknowledge their strengths and abilities. Loving, respecting, and valuing them for who they are.

The Friendship Link programme aspires to empower people with intellectual disability by:

Facilitating friendship among their peer groups and within the wider community, and providing everyday social opportunities and activities.



Our activities range from our infamous monthly Disco and Movie Nights to Pamper, Scrapbooking, Craft activities, Karaoke, Gardening, Dance, Exercise, and more! Our sessions and events are very well attended and there is ample opportunity for social experiences and to develop a variety of skills.

The Friendship Link activities change every few months according to seasonal changes to provide the best environment and skill opportunities for the participants.

Our Community Activity Programme for older persons, the Evergreen Club, is a daily activity programme for those over 65's who still live at home and are seeking additional support in improving and maintaining their current everyday life, health, and wellbeing.

We accommodate 20 members each day - Monday to Friday, 10am - 2.30pm, and are fully operational 48 weeks of the year.



The Evergreen Club embraces the aging process and sees it as an opportunity to make friends, learn a new activity, keep bodies nourished and supple, and keep minds active. Our caring team of well-trained and experienced staff keep the programme interesting and fun for members whilst fully monitoring their individual health, cognitive, and dietary needs.

Our vision is to see our members valued by society.


